PROPOSALS TO THE IDNIYRA BYLAWS & CONSTITUTION

PROPOSAL #1 TO SHORTEN THE NORTH AMERICAN CHAMPIONSHIP

The following proposal to change the Bylaws of the Association is submitted for a vote of the membership at the 2014 Annual Meeting of the Association.

Change By Laws Section B.2.b to read as follows:

When the North American Championship is not held in conjunction with the Gold Cup, the NA regatta is to be held on a specific contiguous three day period commencing on a Friday (official start date) and ending on a Sunday. The specific dates shall be selected by the host Rear Commodore. Racing shall commence no earlier than 10:00AM local time on Friday. A minimum of three races in the Gold fleet shall constitute a regatta. In the event the regatta cannot be completed due to unfavorable conditions within the original three day period, the event may be continued one additional day from the official start date. One postponement of two weeks is permitted. This means that the regatta shall be entirely re-sailed beginning two Fridays, after the original start date using the three day format described above. The original host Rear Commodore and host region shall be responsible for the organization and management of the regatta. Any move to a different region shall be done with the advice and consent of the Governing Committee as described in section B.1. If the regatta cannot be completed at this time it shall be abandoned.

In Support of the Proposal to Shorten the North American Championship by US 3433

There are two simple reasons for supporting the proposal to shorten the North American Championship in the year that it is not held in conjunction with the World Cup. Those two reasons are time and money. The current week long format takes

too much time and costs all concerned too much money.

The time involved in the current week long format is more time than many sailors are able to spend away from work and family. We are trying to encourage participation but exactly the opposite seems to be happening. For younger sailors who face job and family pressures the vacation time involved can not be justified. Additionally, the proposed long weekend format will help to alleviate cost problems for all sailors in leaner economic times.

The costs involved in current format are a double whammy. First, in face of declining participation, fewer sailors and the class in general are asked to support the increasing costs of a week long regatta. As the length of a regatta increases so does the overhead incurred for housing and feeding the necessary staff. The cost to sailors increases as well, and again the longer regatta becomes very difficult to justify on the home front.

The proposal also includes the possibility of extending the regatta one extra day, and the possibility of postponing the regatta for two weeks. The intent of the one day extension is to enable the completion of a regatta if weather and ice conditions are favorable when we already have everybody together. This seems preferable to a postponement and restart from both a time and cost perspective. The two week postponement in the event of unsuitable ice or weather on the scheduled weekend is provided in order to ensure that we have a championship every year without infinite week to week postponements.

This proposal is intended to simultaneously reduce costs and increase participation. It only affects the North American Championship in the year that we do not host the World Cup. Supporting this proposal is in the best interests of the long term health of the class.

PROPOSAL #2 TO ADD A PAST COMMODORE TO THE GOVERNING COMMITTEE'S OFFICERS

"Article VI-Elections and Duties of Officers (add Past Commodore office)

A Commodore, Vice Commodore, Secretary, Treasurer and **Past Commodore** shall be nominated at the annual meeting. They will be voted for by ... (please read the IDNIYRA constitution for the remaining current language of Article VI).

Duties are as follows:

Past Commodore: To serve on the Governing Committee, participate in its deliberations, and vote on decisions. Only members in good standing who have served as an IDNIYRA commodore are eligible. This officer serves as an at-large member."

In Support of the Proposal to Add a Past Commodore to the Governing Committee's Officers by KC 4386 AND US 4192

Rationale: The purpose of this proposal is to benefit the membership by ensuring a seasoned officer always serves on the governing committee, bolstering its institutional memory. The proposal is written so that any IDNIYRA past commodore who agrees to serve may be nominated and stand for election with other class officers.

From time to time, a newly elected commodore, responsible for the final regatta site selection decision, has not had the benefit of previous regatta management or governing committee experience. Typically this happens after a commodore's service ends, the vice commodore chooses to no longer serve, and the secretary and treasurer choose to remain in their present chairs, or may also be newly elected. A past commodore serving on the governing committee will ensure there is always at least one officer with 'hot seat' experience. As an At-Large member, the past commodore represents the common good of all IDNIYRA racers.

SNOW FORCES THE WESTERN CHALLENGE TO MOVE EAST FOR THE FIRST TIME

"IT'S GREAT TO SEE THIS MEETING OF FRIENDS TO ENJOY WHAT WE LOVE IN A RELAXED SETTING" US 5214

DN ice sailors from around the world converged for three days of racing and reacquainting December 6-8, 2013 at the Western Challenge. A midweek snow storm ruined the primary site which is always in Minnesota.

Finding an alternate site became a major challenge and with the help of Markham Chatterton US 4811, a site was found. For the first time in WC history, the Minnesota sailors crossed the Mississippi River and called the fun regatta on for Lake Onalaska in La-Crosse, WI, two and a half hours south east of Minneapolis.

International ice sailors flew in from Russia, Sweden, and the Netherlands to race against some of the top ranked DNers. North American skippers from Canada, Montana, and New England made a leap of faith and began their long drives early in the week with the hope that ice would be found by the time they arrived to the bitter cold of the Midwest.

Friday lived up to its reputation as being the best day of sailing even though temperatures barely made it into double digits F.

Over 60 DNers scrub raced and tuned on the hard, snow-free, slippery, fast black ice in shifty wind blowing around 8 to 12 mph.

"I'll bet the gang sailed two dozen races. I counted over 35 boats all lined up doing a scrub race! It's great to see this meeting of friends to enjoy what we love in an informal atmosphere," blogged Minnesota sailor and IDNIYRA Secretary Jim McDonagh US 5214 on iceboating.net. Of course the day was rehashed back at the hotel bar that evening in anticipation of Saturday's racing.

The familiar waiting for wind game was played most of Saturday and sailors made use of the time by aligning runners, checking gear, and catching up with friends.

Opti sailor Tyler Metzloff and his dad, Kyle US 5522, TJ and Griffin Sherry US 4, and Frankie Hearn US 5479 demonstrated their boomerang catching while running with spikes technique. Finally, at 3 PM, just when a couple of skippers took their sails down, the breeze turned on and the Minnesota team sprang into action, moving marks, setting the starting line in record time, and started cracking off races.

IN GOLD, RON SHERRY US 44 WON THE FIRST RACE WHILE NEW ENGLAND SAILOR CHAD ATKINS US 4487 TOOK THE SECOND RACE. NOT A BAD DAY FOR HIS FIRST EVER WESTERN CHALLENGE.

In Silver, Madison sailors Tim Sugar US 5508 and Dave Elsmo US 5486 each took turns to be first across the finish line. The December sun set fast as the last Silver race of the day concluded and the fleet headed back to the landing in the dusk.

That night, Western Region Rear Commodore Julie Jankowski US 4271 helped to organize an informal get together at a local marina and the large crowd had a great time socializing and eating together in the spirit of a casual and relaxed fun regatta. Everyone went to sleep wondering if the forecasted snow would mean no sailing on Sunday

Sunday morning the landscape was covered in white stuff, looking more like Wisconsin in December. The light fluffy snow didn't affect the ice but conditions were difficult in the light and shifty winds and the scorers had to watch the time limit.

During the first Gold race, Ron Sherry made the time limit during one lap with only 15 seconds to spare. Somehow, the fleet managed to pull off another four races along with an Ice Optimist race. Ron Sherry won both Gold races while Dave Elsmo and Scott Earnest US 5519, another Madison skipper, each won in the Silver.



Seven race regatta format – 3 race minimum in the Gold Fleet will constitute the regatta. Fleets – Gold & Silver Fleet, Plate Runner Division as part of the Silver Fleet, Rookie Division as part of the lowest fleet; Volunteer split for fleets.

2. Eligibility:

All DN class yachts meeting the requirements of the Official Specifications and whose skippers meet the requirements of the By-Laws of the IDNIYRA as stated in the section IDNIYRA Regattas are eligible to enter and race in the championship.

- B. Site and Headquarters Information will be determined by the regatta organizer.



RECORD OF EVENTS
1953 - 1954

On February 21 and 22, 1953 the Detroit Ice Yacht Club sponsored a regatta to bring the D N skippers together to help form an association. A meeting of the skippers was held at this regatta at which two representatives from each club present were chosen to outline a constitution for the association. North Star Sail Club was represented by John Liston and Fred Kagel; Anchor Bay Ice Yacht Club, by Tom King and A J Walker; Detroit Ice Yacht Club by, Wm. B. Sarns and Jack Moran; and Cass Lake by, Chuck and Clifford Cartwright. The representatives met at the home of the Cartwright's the following Sunday afternoon and briefly outlined a constitution. Wm. Sarns was elected to serve as temporary secretary and to compose the constitution. The secretary made it up and sent out copies to the representatives in the following fall. They were returned to the secretary along with the desired changes. The changes the majority wanted were incorporated and 200 copies were printed. A copy was sent out to each individual who attended the first regatta and others who were interested.

On January 17 the Northwestern Ice Yachting Association past a resolution that they would accept the D N Association's specifications for their D N races which are now included in their annual regatta.

On January 7, 54, the North Star Sail Club offered to be host for the annual regatta. There were no other offers so theirs was accepted. Sixty two programs were sent out on February 1, for the regatta scheduled for February 20 and 21. On February 19 the Regatta was transferred to Cass Lake, because of poor ice at the North Star Club House on Lake St. Clair where it was originally intended.
